In West Michigan: 11,500 businesses make 250K or more a year. Only 70 of those are owned by a person of color (Data pulled from Demographics Now). Minority groups make up about 25% of the Grand Rapids population, but less than 1% of BIPOC businesses make \$250k or more. The 250 Project is our attempt to do our part, on the programmatic side, to create a more inclusive ecosystem where all entrepreneurs can thrive.
